Inconvenient Truth ...OR CONSEQUENCES



Stewardship is what we do. Cost is the consequence of our actions. So the question is, What's Your Line?

Is your congregation about to face the horrible fate of bad stewardship? It's not just high utility use and cost, it's the prospect of system demise, and almost

always at the worst possible time.

How do you know your line?

First, consult the *Environmental Stewardship Assessment* prepared by MIP&L for your congregation. (If you don't have one, it's time!) Boilers and chillers 15 or more years old are on their last legs, and are not efficient.

Second, review your running record of Utility Use and Cost. Compare use and cost for each utility type by month for last year and the year before. Do this review every month. Take steps to reduce use without harming programs.

Third, review the status with your maintenance contractor. You do have a maintenance contract, don't you? Good stewardship includes affirmative care.

And then take steps to pick the "low-hanging" fruit of energy efficiency. The least expensive, quickest

benefit is replacing manual with *programmable* thermostats. Get a stat that permits 4 settings each of 7 days.

Interior storms are a good, economical way to improve occupant comfort and reduce energy use.
